

CHAPTER 58.

AN ACT

[H. B. 75]

To amend Section 4065, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relative to what disbursements a litigant may be allowed by way of costs, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Amended.

Section 1. That Section 4065, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Costs allowed
in civil cases.

“Section 4065. A party entitled to costs shall also be allowed for all necessary disbursements, including the fees of officers and witnesses, the necessary expense of taking depositions by commission or otherwise, the expense of publication of the summons or notices, and the postage where the same are served by mail, the compensation of referees, and the necessary expense of copying any public record, book or document used as evidence on the trial; for each deposition such sum as may be allowed by the court; the per diem actually paid the court reporter but not to exceed ten dollars per day; witness fees for each day a witness is necessarily absent from his usual place of abode by reason of attendance upon court, with traveling expenses at fifteen cents per mile actually and necessarily travelled; a party to the action, if a witness, shall be entitled to the same fees and traveling expense as any other witness.

Emergency.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval.
