

## CHAPTER 7.

## AN ACT

[S. B. 9]

To provide for accepting the benefits of Title VI of the Federal Social Security Act, relating to the protection of the Public Health; to provide for controlling and curbing the spread of infectious, contagious and hereditary diseases, and providing penalties for violations.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. For the purpose of carrying out the plan presented by the Commissioner of Health for the Territory, and approved by the Surgeon General of the United States Public Health Service, under Title VI, Section 602, d, of the Social Security Act, for which Federal benefits are being received by the Territory and to provide for the acceptance of such additional benefits as may, from time to time, be granted, to make more adequate provision for protecting the public health and for controlling and curbing the spread of infectious and contagious diseases, the Commissioner of Health is hereby authorized and directed to promulgate and adopt rules and regulations providing for:

A. An annual medical examination of barbers, cosmetologists, and persons employed in the production of food products and the handling thereof in restaurants, lunch counter, soft drink establishments, beer and wine dispensaries, butcher shops, bakeries and other similar establishments.

B. Standards of cleanliness and sanitation in connection with the operation of any cannery or other establishments where food products are manufactured, and for barber shops, cosmetological establishments, soft drink establishments, beer and wine dispensaries

and similar establishments in which food or drink is sold or offered for sale to the public.

**Labelling and Grading of Milk.**

C. Labelling and grading of milk according to the Standard Milk Ordinance approved by the United States Public Health Service and for standards of cleanliness and sanitation in the operation of dairies selling or offering for sale milk or milk products.

**Public Water Supplies**

D. Protection of public water supplies.

**Board of Administration to approve regulations.**

Provided that all such rules and regulations shall receive the written approval of the Board of Administration before becoming operative.

**Report to Governor, when and contents.**

Section 2. Within sixty days after the close of each calendar year the Commissioner shall make a report to the Governor for the preceding year stating in detail:

- (a) the total amount of money received;
- (b) the total amount of money expended;
- (c) the total number of health certificates issued;
- (d) the total number of persons examined;
- (e) the total number of examinations of canneries, restaurants, barber shops and other establishments, and
- (f) such other information as may be deemed advisable or required.

**To cooperate with U. S.**

Section 3. The Commissioner of Health is hereby authorized and directed to cooperate with the United States and its established or created agencies charged with the protection of the Public Health, and to apply for and receive such grants of sums of money from the United States as may be or become available for the

administration of the public health laws of the Federal and Territorial governments and for that purpose and to that end this law is enacted.

Section 4. No fee or charge shall be imposed by the Territorial Department of Health for carrying out the provisions of this Act. Fees and Charges.

Section 5. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Act, or any rule or regulation promulgated hereunder, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) or imprisonment for not more than thirty days. Violations, Penalty.

## CHAPTER 8.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 10]

Amending that certain Act passed and approved on the 2nd day of April, 1937, being an Act entitled, "An Act relating to the providing for old-age assistance, accepting the provisions of Federal legislation for old-age assistance, declaring its effective date, and repealing all Acts and parts of Acts in conflict with any provision hereof.", by adding thereto another section fixing the date on which the provisions of said Act will be effective.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That that certain Act passed and approved on the 2nd day of April, 1937, entitled, "An Act relating to and providing for old-age assistance, Amended.
