

## CHAPTER 70.

## AN ACT

[S. B. 56]

To aid private trappers in the taking of predatory animals, mainly wolves and coyotes, by giving instructions as to the best methods of trapping, by the free distribution of scented bait material, and by other means; for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Act, making an appropriation of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00), and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Appropriation  
for control of  
predatory  
animals.

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) out of the funds of the Territory to cooperate with Federal Agencies in the control of predatory animals in Alaska by the purchase of scented bait material, wolf traps and other appliances, and for the salary and expense of a wolf trapping expert, to be used in conjunction with other funds provided by the Federal Agencies.

Appropriation

Section 2. That Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) of the sum hereby appropriated be placed in a revolving fund for the purchase of approved steel wolf and coyote traps, arms and ammunition for resale to private trappers at cost.

How expended.

Section 3. That the funds hereby appropriated shall be expended under the direction of the Board of Administration as it shall deem most suitable in accomplishing the purposes herein set forth.

Disposition of  
animals taken.

Section 4. That all wolves or coyotes taken by salaried trappers paid from any of these funds be rendered ineligible for bounty by punching holes in both ears and by the entire removal of the bones of the left forearm, which shall be destroyed and a record of same shall be sent to Game Commission, and that the pelts

of wolves, coyotes, or other animals taken by salaried trappers be turned over to the Alaska Game Commission for disposition as are other raw furs handled by the said Commission.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist Emergency. and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 71.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 74]

To prohibit the parking or placing of any vehicle or other article upon the runway of any aviation field, providing punishment for the violation of any provision hereof and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to park or place upon the runway of any aviation field in this Territory any wagon, sled, motor vehicle or other article unless such wagon, sled, motor vehicle or other article is actually used in connection with the construction or repair of such field. Parking on airplane runways prohibited.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of the foregoing Section shall be deemed guilty Penalty. of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) or by imprisonment for not more than thirty days or by both such fine and imprisonment.
