## HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 24

TO THE TERRITORIAL BOARD OF ROAD COMMISSIONERS  
FOR THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

Your Memorialist the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska in the thirteenth regular session assembled, respectfully submits that:

WHEREAS, the road leading from Manley Hot Springs to Eureka, a distance of about twenty-four miles would very materially contribute to the mining development of that area and since the existing road is in a very bad state of repair if not almost impassable.

WHEREFORE, your Memorialist respectfully urges that the matter of the rehabilitation of the road between Manley Hot Springs and Eureka be given your earnest attention when the road program for the season of nineteen hundred and thirty-seven is being considered.

## HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 27

TO THE HONORABLE ANTHONY J. DIMOND, DELEGATE  
TO CONGRESS FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in regular session assembled, respectfully represents that:

WHEREAS, it appears that the present Alaska Game Law is restrictive in that it provides only for enforcement of the game laws; and

WHEREAS, there are many other wildlife activities which should properly be handled by the Alaska Game Commission, to-wit, feeding of wild game during severe winters, restocking of depleted areas, general investigations including predatory animal control and other activities beneficial to the wildlife resources of the Territory; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Congress of the United States to amend the present Alaska Game Law in order to achieve these desired results;

NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully urges that the Alaska Game Law be amended to authorize the above mentioned activities, together with such other changes as the Congress shall deem necessary in this connection.

### HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 28

TO THE TERRITORIAL BOARD OF ROAD COMMISSIONERS  
FOR THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

Your Memorialist the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska in the thirteenth regular session assembled respectfully submits that:

WHEREAS, Gold Run and the Bluestone River constitute an important mining area in northwestern Alaska that has produced gold for the past thirty-six years and is still producing gold; and,

WHEREAS, placer mining operations today are being carried on upon ground where the gold content is comparatively low and hence involving the use of machinery; and,

WHEREAS, placer mining machinery consists for the most part of very heavy equipment and such equipment together with the supplies necessary to carry on mining operations, must be transported overland; and,

WHEREAS, the question in Alaska as to whether or not mining ground can be profitably worked frequently rests entirely upon the transportation facilities; and,

WHEREAS, there are now two dredges operating in the district referred to upon what might be regarded as comparatively high grade ground, but that there are miles of potential dredging ground yet to be developed; and,
