

HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 58

TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE DELEGATE FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in thirteenth regular session assembled, most respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, the Honorable Anthony J. Dimond, Delegate to Congress from Alaska, did on January 5, 1937, introduce in the Congress of the United States H. R. 1562, providing for "Transferring the jurisdiction, supervision, administration, and control over the salmon and other fisheries of Alaska, except the fur-seal and sea-otter fisheries, from the Department of Commerce to the Territory of Alaska, and for other purposes," and

WHEREAS, the people of the Territory of Alaska have the welfare of their country at heart and are capable of administering their own affairs, and of administering the fisheries of Alaska by virtue of their connection therewith;

NOW, THEREFORE, we, your memorialist, do most earnestly pray that said H. R. 1562 be speedily enacted into law.

HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 59

TO THE HONORABLE FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND TO THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of Alaska, in regular session assembled, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, fishing is the major industry in the coastal regions of Alaska and furnishes employment and subsistence to a very large percentage of the inhabitants of the coastal regions; and
