

HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 69

TO THE TERRITORIAL BOARD OF ROAD COMMISSIONERS:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in Thirteenth Regular Session assembled, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, the recent storms have washed out several bridges and destroyed the Fish Creek trail in several places, making it practically unusable from the highway up Fish Creek; and

WHEREAS, it is believed that repairs should be made to this trail as early as practicable; and

WHEREAS, there is immediate necessity for the construction of a trail from the Texas Creek highway over Connor Mountain to Chickamun Glacier, and with the expected increase in mining in the vicinity during the coming year it is urgently necessary that work on this trail be commenced;

NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist urgently prays that Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) of the funds allotted to the First Division by the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners for the construction of roads, be allotted to the rehabilitation of the Fish Creek trail, and an additional Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) of such funds be used in the construction of a road to Chickamun Glacier in the Hyder district.
