NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Thirteenth Session of the Legislature of Alaska that we heartily approve the provisions of said bill and respectfully request that the same be enacted into law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Joint Resolution be mailed to the Honorable Franklin D. Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, to the Honorable President of the Senate and to the Honorable Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States and to the Honorable Anthony J. Dimond, Delegate to Congress from Alaska.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 4

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

That the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, being truly appreciative of the interest manifested and the aid rendered by His Excellency, Franklin D. Roosevelt, President of the United States of America; and,

Since January 30 is the fifty-fifth birthday of the President, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House be and hereby are instructed to express by telegram to His Excellency, Franklin D. Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, congratulations upon his birthday and the well wishes of the Legislature and the entire people of the Territory of Alaska.
