

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 8

TO THE HONORABLE FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, TO THE HONORABLE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND TO THE HONORABLE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES, AND TO HONORABLE ANTHONY J. DIMOND, DELEGATE FROM ALASKA:

WHEREAS, the Honorable Anthony J. Dimond, Delegate to Congress from Alaska, has introduced in the House of Representatives of the United States now in session, H. R. 1565, amending the Act of Congress approved June 6, 1924, entitled "An Act for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for other purposes" and providing particularly against seizure of boats or paraphernalia used in fishing, until the owner or operator shall have been convicted of illegal fishing; and

WHEREAS, we believe that this bill fairly reflects the views of a large majority of the people of this Territory upon the subject covered;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Thirteenth Session of the Legislature of Alaska that we heartily approve the provisions of said bill and respectfully request that the same be enacted into law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this joint resolution be mailed to the Honorable Franklin D. Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, to the Honorable President of the Senate and to the Honorable Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States, and to the Honorable Anthony J. Dimond, Delegate from Alaska.
