SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 2

TO THE TERRITORIAL BOARD OF ROAD COMMISSIONERS
FOR THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska in the Thirteenth Regular Session assembled, respectfully submits that:

WHEREAS, the incorporated village of Craig has a population of two hundred and thirty-one (231) persons and the incorporated village of Klawock a population of four hundred and thirty-seven (437) persons, and

WHEREAS, the distance between the villages is about six and one half (6½) miles overland and considerably longer by water, and

WHEREAS, no vehicular road exists between the said two villages and the trail is passable only at stages of low water and therefore used only to a very limited extent, and

WHEREAS, the distance along the proposed location of a road connecting the two villages is six and one half (6½) miles, and

WHEREAS, there are desirable homestead sites along the proposed road that would be quickly and permanently settled if such road were constructed, and

WHEREAS, the Territory of Alaska, through the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners, has already initiated work on this road to the extent of clearing and grubbing a part of the right of way,

NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist respectfully urges that the work on this project be diligently continued with the view to completing the construction of said road in the near future.
