

SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 6

TO THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS, TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska in the Thirteenth Regular Session assembled, respectfully submits that:

WHEREAS, the village of Kake, Alaska, is primarily a fishing center, making it necessary that numerous vessels be harbored there; and

WHEREAS, the present harbor is inadequate for that purpose and it is necessary to moor these boats in the deeper water along the shore east of the village; and

WHEREAS, there is a road running from Kake one mile in an easterly direction toward such deeper water; and

WHEREAS, many residents of Kake have expressed a desire to take up homesites beyond the end of the present road in closer proximity to such deeper water;

NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist respectfully urges that the Bureau of Public Roads do, at the earliest opportunity, extend the said road for one and one-half miles.
