SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 1

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate, that no Bills, Memorials nor Resolutions shall be introduced in the Senate at the Extraordinary Session of the Territorial Legislature convened on March 19, 1937, except such Bills, Memorials or Resolutions as pertain to the adoption or rejection by the Legislature of the several features of the Act of Congress approved August 14, 1935, known as the Federal Social Security Act, and such additional Bills, Memorials or Resolutions as may be required to provide revenue necessary to carry out those features of said Act which may be accepted. Provided, however, that other Bills, Memorials or Resolutions may be introduced with the consent of two-thirds of all the members to which the Senate is entitled.
