

CHAPTER 9.

AN ACT

[S. B. 13]

To reduce the interest rate on bonds of the Town of Wrangell, Alaska, now held by the Territory of Alaska, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That at the next regular interest date, ^{Wrangell, Alaska.} to-wit, July 1, 1939, and all interest dates thereafter, ^{Bond interest reduced to 4%.} the Treasurer of the Territory shall accept in full payment 4% interest on bonds owned and held by the Territory and issued by the incorporated Town of Wrangell, Alaska, and described as 6% school bonds, dated January 1, 1931, in place and stead of the 6% interest provided in said bonds, and it is further provided that the waiving of the 2% interest as herein set forth shall in no way or manner whatsoever decrease the face value of said bonds or the obligations of the said Town of Wrangell, to pay the full face value thereof.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act is to take effect immediately upon its ^{Emergency.} passage and approval.

CHAPTER 10.

AN ACT

[S. B. 15]

To appropriate the sum of \$540.00 for the relief of Fred W. Wagner, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated the sum ^{Appropriation for Fred W. Wagner.} of \$540.00 for the relief of Fred W. Wagner.

How paid.

Section 2. The treasurer is hereby directed to pay said sum to the said Fred W. Wagner, at the rate of \$45.00 per month.

Emergency.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 11.

AN ACT

[H. B. 14]

To appropriate funds for payment of deficiencies in various appropriations heretofore made, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Deficiency appropriations for biennium ending March 31, 1939.

Section 1. The following sums of money are hereby appropriated from the Treasury of the Territory, or as much thereof as shall in each case be necessary, for the purposes stated below, which appropriations are to be supplementary to the appropriations heretofore made for the biennium ending March 31, 1939, for the same purposes:

For Attorney General.

(a) Office of Attorney General: Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for traveling expenses, Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for contingent office expenses, and Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for court costs.

For Auditor.

(b) Office of the Auditor of Alaska: Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for vital statistics, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for
