CHAPTER 28.

AN ACT

[H. B. 54]

To amend Section 589 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, as amended by Chapter 62 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1935, relating to the bounty on hair seals, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 589 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, as amended by Chapter 62 of the Session ^{Amended.} Laws of Alaska 1935, is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Sec. 589. Bounty on Hair Seal. There is hereby placed upon every hair seal inhabiting the inland waters and all waters adjacent to the southern coast of Alaska and east of the 152nd Meridian, and the waters of Bering Sea, and Golovin Bay lying within a line drawn from the tip of Rocky Point to the tip of Cape Darby, a bounty of Three Dollars (\$3.00), such sum to be paid in accordance with the provisions following.”

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in force from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 29.

AN ACT

[H. B. 93]

To compensate Felix Andrea for services rendered in connection with the death and burial of Sam Callahan, deceased, making an appropriation and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

**Appropriation
for Felix
Andrea.**

Section 1. The sum of One Hundred and Ninety-five (\$195.00) Dollars is hereby appropriated, out of the Treasury of Alaska of moneys not otherwise appropriated, to compensate Felix Andrea, of Holy Cross, Alaska, for services rendered in reporting the death and in the burial of Sam Callahan of Lonesome River, Alaska, which occurred in the fall of 1932.

How paid.

Section 2. Payment for the above shall be made on vouchers approved by the District Judge of the Fourth Judicial Division of Alaska.

Emergency.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act is to take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
