

CHAPTER 34.

AN ACT

[H. B. 143]

To appropriate the sum of Sixty-six Dollars (\$66.00), to pay J. C. Strand, Eric Todal and Al Munson for services rendered in the search of the gasboat "Virginia", and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated the sum of ^{Appropriation for gasboat "Virginia" search.} Sixty-six Dollars (\$66.00), to pay J. C. Strand, Eric Todal and Al Munson for services rendered in the search of the gasboat "Virginia."

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist ^{Emergency.} and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 35.

AN ACT

[H. B. 125]

To compensate H. C. Longley for services rendered in connection with the death and burial of John Land at Shelton, Alaska, making an appropriation, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The sum of Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) is hereby appropriated out of monies in the Treasury ^{Appropriation for burial of John Land.} of Alaska not otherwise appropriated, to compensate H. C. Longley for services rendered in connection with the death and burial of John Land at Shelton, Alaska.

How paid.

Section 2. Payment of the above sum shall be made on a voucher approved by the Governor of Alaska.

Emergency.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 36.

AN ACT

[H. B. 80]

To amend Sections 2412 and 2413, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relating to Public Utilities, and providing a penalty.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The first paragraph of Section 2412 is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 2412. Duties of public utilities; discrimination; punishment for. It shall be the duty of every person or corporation operating wholly or partially within a municipality a public service plant or undertaking by such plant to supply the inhabitants of a city with telephone service, water, power, lighterage, wharfage, dockage, storage, heat or light or kindred public service, to serve everybody alike without discrimination, and without denial, except for good and sufficient cause, and every person and corporation undertaking to supply such public service shall establish and promulgate reasonable rules and regulations for the conduct of such business and the operation of
