CHAPTER 61.

AN ACT

[S. B. 58]

Prescribing the manner of presenting claims against the Territory for labor, material, supplies, personal services and money expended, and providing for a review of disallowance thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That every claim for reimbursement for money expended, or for compensation for labor, materials or supplies furnished, or for personal services rendered to or on behalf of the Territory, whether based on a contractual relation or a ratification, shall be promptly presented to the appropriate administrative or executive officer for approval and payment. If such claim be disallowed in whole or in part, the claimant may obtain a review of the action of such officer by applying within sixty days to the Territorial Board of Administration, at Juneau, orally or in writing, for such review, in which event the officer concerned shall transmit such claim, together with all papers and memoranda in relation thereto to the Territorial Board of Administration. Upon receipt thereof the Board shall proceed to reexamine the merits of the claim, and to that end may adopt any appropriate procedure not inconsistent with existing law, and shall render its

decision affirming, modifying or reversing the action of the officer, which decision may be oral if made in the presence of the claimant, or in writing.

CHAPTER 62.

AN ACT

[S. B. 82]

To amend the 6th paragraph of Section 1, Chapter 20, Session Laws of Alaska, 1937.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the 6th paragraph of Section 1, Chapter 20, Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, be amended to read as follows:

“GOLD, PLATINUM, PALLADIUM, OSMIUM, IRRIDIUM, AND ANY OTHER METAL OR MINERAL BELONGING TO THE PLATINUM OR PALLADIUM GROUP. The license tax on all gold, platinum, osmium, irridium and any other metal or mineral belonging to the platinum or palladium group produced in any mine or mines in the Territory of Alaska, shall be 3% upon the cash value of the gross production in excess of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00).”
