

## CHAPTER 85.

## AN ACT

[H. B. 119]

Authorizing the purchase of the Fred L. Goddard Homestead for use as an additional Alaska Pioneers' Home, appropriating funds for its repair and maintenance, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Goddard Hot Springs purchase authorized.

Section 1. That the Board of Trustees of the Alaska Pioneers' Home is hereby authorized and directed to purchase that certain property known as the Fred L. Goddard Homestead, near Sitka, Alaska, consisting of twenty-eight and fifty-eight hundredths (28.58) acres of land and a group of mineral hot springs, more particularly described in United States Public Land Survey No. 1401, and all buildings, appurtenances and improvements on said land, for use as an additional Alaska Pioneers' Home; not to exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) to be expended on said purchase.

Appropriation for purchase.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated out of funds in the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) to be paid by the Treasurer upon vouchers approved by the Board of Trustees of the Alaska Pioneers' Home to defray all costs of said purchase.

Appropriation for repairs, operation, etc.

Section 3. There is also hereby appropriated the further sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) for necessary repairs and improvements to the buildings and grounds and for operation and maintenance costs for the next biennium.

Home for pioneer women authorized.

Section 4. The Board of Trustees of the Alaska Pioneers' Home is also hereby authorized to set aside any portion of the land or buildings as it may deem necessary as a home for Pioneer women.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval. <sup>Emergency.</sup>

## CHAPTER 86.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 16]

To provide for the obtaining of bids and awarding of contracts for all purchases in excess of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), made in behalf of the Territory of Alaska, repealing Sections 2801 and 2802 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska 1933, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. Every public office, institution, officer or employee of the Territory of Alaska shall obtain sealed competitive bids in writing for all purchases of any kind made in behalf of the Territory of Alaska, where the cost shall be in excess of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), and shall award the contract to the lowest responsible bidder subject, however, to the following conditions:

(a) That wherever amount of materials or supplies necessary for a year's time at any institution in the Territory can be reasonably computed, the call for bids shall specify the amounts and conditions of delivery.

(b) In contracts where the amount involved is in excess of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), the call for bids must be published in a newspaper as near as possible to the place where the contract is to be performed or in the town in which the head office and the administration is situated; such publications to
