

## CHAPTER 87.

## AN ACT

[H. B. 36, 37, 38]

To correct errors in Sections 3404, 3646 and 3466, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That the first sentence of Section 3404, <sup>Amended.</sup> Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 3404. Publication, how made; personal service out of Territory. The order shall direct the publication to be made in a newspaper to be designated by the court or judge or clerk or justice of the peace as the most likely to give notice to the person to be served, and for such length of time as may be deemed reasonable, not less than once a week for four weeks.” <sup>Publication of summons, how made, etc.</sup>

Section 2. That the Fifth sub-section of Section 3466, <sup>Amended.</sup> Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Fifth. When the defendant has removed or disposed of his property, or is about to do so, with the intent to defraud his creditors. <sup>When defendant may be arrested.</sup>

“But no female shall be arrested in any action except for injury to person, character, or property.”

Section 3. The Section 3646, <sup>Amended.</sup> Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Motion for new trial when filed, and determined. A motion for a new trial, with the affidavits, if any in support thereof, shall, except as hereinafter provided, be filed within three days after giving the verdict or other decision sought to be set aside; but the court may, upon satisfactory showing, extend the time for filing <sup>Motion for new trial, when filed, etc.</sup>

such motion and affidavits. When the adverse party is entitled to oppose the motion by counter affidavits, he shall file the same within three days after the filing of the motion, or within such further time as the court may allow. A motion shall be heard and determined during the term unless the court continues the same for advisement or want of time to hear it."

## CHAPTER 88.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 36]

To amend subsection 3 of Section 5, Chapter 78, Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, as amended by Chapter 1, Session Laws of Alaska, 1937 Special Session, relating to the sale of intoxicating liquor, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Amended.

Section 1. Subsection 3 of Section 5, Chapter 78, Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, as amended by Chapter 1, Session Laws of Alaska, 1937 Special Session is hereby amended by adding thereto the following sentence:

Intoxicating  
liquor license  
within 200 feet  
of school.

"Be it further provided, however, that when a license for the sale of intoxicating liquor in any building within two hundred feet of a school house or church is forfeited by reason of a violation of law, no license for the sale of intoxicating liquor on those premises shall thereafter be issued."

Emergency.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
