HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 34.

TO THE CIVIL AERONAUTICS AUTHORITY OF THE UNITED STATES:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in Fourteenth Regular Session assembled, does most respectfully represent that:

WHEREAS, on December 27, 1938, the President of the United States approved a program presented by the Civil Aeronautics Authority for the annual training of approximately 20,000 airplane pilots in the colleges and universities of the United States, and authorized the allocation of \$100,000.00 of National Youth Administration funds for inaugurating the program; and,

WHEREAS, certain universities and colleges have been designated as places to be used for the present test semester for the training of airplane pilots; and,

WHEREAS, the University of Alaska at Fairbanks, Alaska, is an ideal place for training airplane pilots, for many reasons, which include the following:

1. The climatic conditions are most favorable;
2. There is more air traffic in and out of Fairbanks, Alaska, in proportion to the population and the territory served, than in any other place in the world;

3. There are ample landing fields in Fairbanks and the vicinity, which could be used in the work of training pilots;

4. Local instructors, familiar with the country and with the art of flying, are available at Fairbanks;

5. The Army and Navy of the United States are making plans for the establishment of air bases in the Territory of Alaska.

NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully requests that the University of Alaska be chosen by the Civil Aeronautics Authority as one of the places for training airplane pilots under the program approved by the President on December 27, 1938, and that funds be provided and steps taken for the training at the University of Alaska, during the present year, of such number of student pilots as may be designated by the Civil Aeronautics Authority.

HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 35.

TO THE HONORABLE JOHN COLLIER, COMMISSIONER OF INDIAN AFFAIRS, AND TO THE HONORABLE ANTHONY J. DIMOND, DELEGATE TO CONGRESS FROM THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in Fourteenth Regular Session assembled, respectfully submits that:

WHEREAS, official vital statistic records show that more than three times as many deaths in the Territory result from tuberculosis than from any other cause, with a preponderance of the victims of Native, Eskimo and Indian blood; and,

WHEREAS, the Office of Indian Affairs, recognizing the gravity of the problem, is endeavoring to provide badly needed hospital facilities for the Native population; and,
