

Senate Joint Resolutions

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

That the Committee on Finance and Corporations in the Senate and the Committee on Ways and Means in the House of Representatives of the Fourteenth Session of the Alaska Legislature be authorized to expend at and during the present session, the sum of Six Hundred (\$600.00) Dollars each, or as much thereof as may be necessary for required supplies and for employment of clerical and stenographic help. Such employees to be subject to the call of the committees to which they may be assigned to perform specific duties, and to perform such general clerical and stenographic work as may be required by the members of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

The Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the above sums upon vouchers issued by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 2.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

That the committees of the House and of the Senate on Judiciary and Federal Relations, at and during the present Session, be authorized to expend the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) each, or as much thereof as may be necessary, for required supplies and for the employment of additional clerical help.

The Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the above sums upon vouchers approved by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

WHEREAS the progress of legislation has been materially delayed and the members have been put to much inconvenience because of the failure to execute contracts covering the printing of the daily journals of the Senate and of the House of Representatives and of the advance sheets of the session laws as passed; and

WHEREAS the work of both branches of the Legislature is becoming more difficult because of this delay, which should be remedied at once:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Fourteenth Session of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska in regular session assembled, that the Governor of Alaska, whose duty it is to direct the expenditure of money for the purposes above mentioned, be, and he is hereby requested to execute such contracts, in the same manner as heretofore executed, as will permit the immediate printing of said daily journals and advance sheets of the Session Laws, for the use of the members of the said Legislature.
