

CHAPTER 11.

AN ACT

[H. B. 21]

To amend Section 2225, Chapter XLII, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relating to the practice of medicine and license required, to include provision with regard to citizenship.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

License to
practice medi-
cine—applicant
must be a
citizen.

Section 1. That Section 2225, Chapter XLII, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

“That no license shall be granted to practice medicine or surgery unless the applicant therefor be a citizen of the United States.”

CHAPTER 12.

AN ACT

[H. B. 42]

To authorize the payment of \$73.05 to Frank J. Wadman, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Refund of
escheated bank
deposit.

Section 1. That the Territorial Treasurer is authorized and directed to pay out of the general fund of the Territory the sum of \$73.05 to Frank J. Wadman, 416

West 3rd Street, Aberdeen, Washington, representing the amount of a bank deposit in the Miners and Merchants Bank of Ketchikan, owned by Frank J. Wadman at the time of its escheat to the Territory.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in effect from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 13.

AN ACT

[H. B. 52]

To appropriate the sum of \$34.17 to reimburse James S. Truitt, Attorney General for the Territory, for moneys expended for extra clerical assistance during the year 1940.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the sum of \$34.17 be, and the same is, hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to reimburse James S. Truitt, Attorney General of Alaska, for moneys advanced by him for extra clerical help in the office of Attorney General during the year 1940, said sum being a deficiency over and above the amount appropriated for such purposes at the 1939 Session of the Legislature.
