CHAPTER 34.

AN ACT

[H. B. 128]

To permit the filing of Birth Certificates of those persons born in the Territory of Alaska and for whom no legal certificate has been filed; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Vital Statistics:
birth certificate,
substitute for,
contents.

Section 1. All persons born in the Territory of Alaska for whom no legal birth certificate has been filed, may, if they so desire, have a standard certificate of their birth executed by the doctor, midwife, parents or others

who know the facts of the birth, and such certificate shall be supported by the affidavit of the person executing the certificate and by the affidavits of two other persons who know the facts and know the statements in said certificate are true and correct. The said certificate is to be filed in the manner and form required by Section 3197, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 35.

AN ACT

[S. B. 24]

Authorizing the purchase of the Alaska Library of the late James Wickersham and making an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. A sum not in excess of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) is hereby appropriated out of moneys in the Treasury of Alaska not otherwise appropriated for the purchase of the Alaska Library of the late James Wickersham, and shall be paid on vouchers approved by at least three members of the Territorial Historical Library and Museum Commission.
