

who know the facts of the birth, and such certificate shall be supported by the affidavit of the person executing the certificate and by the affidavits of two other persons who know the facts and know the statements in said certificate are true and correct. The said certificate is to be filed in the manner and form required by Section 3197, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 35.

AN ACT

[S. B. 24]

Authorizing the purchase of the Alaska Library of the late James Wickersham and making an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. A sum not in excess of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) is hereby appropriated out of moneys in the Treasury of Alaska not otherwise appropriated for the purchase of the Alaska Library of the late James Wickersham, and shall be paid on vouchers approved by at least three members of the Territorial Historical Library and Museum Commission.

Territorial Historical Library and Museum Commission to appraise and buy.

Section 2. The Territorial Historical Library and Museum Commission shall make an appraisal of the items that comprise the said Library and is authorized to negotiate on behalf of, and purchase the same for, the Territory of Alaska.

Section 3. The Library, on acquisition, shall be placed in the Alaska Historical Library and Museum for reference use.

CHAPTER 36.

AN ACT

[S. B. 28]

To authorize the Treasurer to waive provisions of Chapter 41, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, providing for payment of bounties on Wolves and Coyotes; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Bounties.—wolves and coyotes; Treasurer may waive requirements as to claim for, when.

Section 1. The Territorial Treasurer is hereby authorized to approve vouchers and pay claims for bounties on wolves and coyotes made upon applications which failed to comply with the provisions of Chapter 41, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, if in his opinion any such claim is made in good faith and without design to defraud the Territory. But the authority herein granted shall not extend beyond March 31, 1941.
