## CHAPTER 37.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 56]

Authorizing the purchase of 24 Pastel Paintings of Tribal Native Peoples of Alaska, from Mrs. Nina Crumrine, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That the sum of \$3,600.00 is hereby appropriated out of the moneys in the Treasury of Alaska, not otherwise appropriated, for the purchase from Mrs. Nina Crumrine, for the Alaska Historical Library and Museum, of 24 Pastel Paintings, including frames therefor, of Tribal Native Peoples of Alaska owned and painted by her, as follows:
