Section 12. CONSTRUCTION OF ACT. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prevent any person from nursing any other person, either gratuitously or for hire; provided, that such person so nursing shall not represent herself as being a registered nurse or a graduate nurse.

Appropriation.

Section 13. To carry out the provisions of this Act, there is hereby appropriated the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars to be expended in the manner provided by law in payment of per diem, traveling expenses and other incidental expenses of the Board, or the members thereof. Vouchers for the payment of expenses incurred under this Act, shall be approved by the President of the Nurses' Examining Board, and referred to the Auditor of the Territory of Alaska for payment.

CHAPTER 47.

AN ACT

[S. B. 40]

To amend Sections 2381 and 2390, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, as amended by Chapter 75, Section 1, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, and to repeal Section 2409, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, as amended by Chapter 75, Section 1, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 2381, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, as amended by Chapter 75, Section 1, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 2381. Unless otherwise provided in conformity with the provisions of the following sections, the mayor shall have power to appoint a clerk, a treasurer, an assessor, a municipal magistrate, a municipal attorney, a chief of police, and such other officials and employees as may be advisable; but all appointments shall be subject to confirmation of the council. All officers appointed by the mayor and confirmed by the council shall hold office at the pleasure of the council, but not beyond the term of the mayor by whom they were appointed.

Municipal Corporations; Mayor to appoint city officers subject to council's confirmation.

Section 2. That Section 2390, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, as amended by Chapter 75, Section 1, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 2390. It shall be the duty of the mayor to preside at meetings of the council, to approve or disapprove of all ordinances or resolutions passed by the council, to sign all warrants drawn on the city treasury, to direct and supervise the business of the city to see that all ordinances and resolves are executed. If the mayor was elected as a member of the council, he shall have a vote on all matters, but if he was elected mayor by direct vote of the people, then he shall have no vote except in case of a tie. Any ordinance or resolution passed by the council by only four affirmative votes, may be vetoed by the mayor at the time of its passage. Upon vetoing any ordinance or resolution the mayor shall submit to the council at its next regular meeting, a written statement giving his reasons for vetoing same. Any ordinance or resolution so vetoed, thereafter passed, or adopted by the affirmative vote of five members of the council

at any regular meeting shall become effective without the signature of the mayor and notwithstanding such veto.

Section 3. Section 2409, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, as amended by Chapter 75, Section 1, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 48.

AN ACT

[H. B. 115]

To appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars, or so much therefor as may be necessary, to assist the City of Haines in the completion of a school and gymnasium, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Appropriation
for.

Section 1. The sum of One Thousand Dollars, is hereby appropriated out of the funds in the Treasury of the Territory not otherwise appropriated to assist the City of Haines, Alaska, in the completion of their school building.

Section 2. The said sum shall be expended under the supervision of the Common Council of said City of Haines and shall be paid by the Territorial Treasurer upon vouchers approved by the Commissioner of Education.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
