

House Joint Resolutions

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

That the Committee on Permanent Help of the House and of the Senate at and during the present Session be authorized to expend the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars each or as much thereof as may be necessary for required supplies and for the employment of additional clerical help.

That the Committee on Finance and Corporations in the Senate and the Committee on Ways and Means in the House, at and during the present Session, be authorized to expend the sum of Six Hundred (\$600.00) Dollars each or so much thereof as may be necessary for required supplies and for the employment of additional clerical help.

That the Committee of the House and Senate on Judiciary and Federal Relations, at and during the present Session, be authorized to expend the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) Dollars each or as much thereof as may be necessary for required supplies and for the employment of additional clerical help.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 2

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

That the Governor of Alaska be, and he hereby is, authorized to employ, for such number of hours per day and for such compensation as shall to him seem necessary and reasonable, a janitor

and charwoman to clean, care for and keep in proper order the rooms occupied by the Legislature; and that the expenses necessarily incurred therefore, not in any event to exceed Four Hundred (\$400.00) Dollars shall be paid by warrants drawn on the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska upon vouchers approved by the Governor.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 3

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS, Carl Dunlap, a miner and pioneer resident of the Territory of Alaska, did, on or about February, 1928, while engaged as a miner and prospector in the Chandelar Mining District, Alaska, sustain an injury, by an accidental explosion of dynamite, whereby he, the said Carl Dunlap, was completely blinded in both eyes, and

WHEREAS, his blindness has proven to be permanent and total, and

WHEREAS, the said Carl Dunlap had to leave the Territory of Alaska on or about August 20, 1929, for special medical attention, and he has continued to reside away from Alaska since that time, and

WHEREAS, although he is a pioneer of Alaska in every sense of the word he is not eligible for old age assistance as provided by Chapter 2, of the Extraordinary Session of the Thirteenth Territorial Legislature, because he has not actually been in the Territory for five of the last nine years,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Department of Public Welfare of the Territory of Alaska is hereby authorized to grant assistance in the amount of Sixty (\$60.00) Dollars per month to the said Carl Dunlap out of the funds appropriated for allowances to aged residents of the Territory of Alaska.
