

said former as well as said new undertaking, stipulation or bond and stand in the place of and become substitute or substitutes for the surety or sureties on said former undertaking, stipulation or bond.

Sureties discharged, when.

Section 2. Upon the filing or presenting of such new undertaking, stipulation or bond, and the approval thereof as to form, penalty and surety, the former undertaking, stipulation or bond, as well as the surety or sureties thereon, shall be immediately discharged from all liability in any manner or at any time arising or accruing.

## CHAPTER 32.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 42]

To prohibit the exportation from Alaska of merchandise rationed anywhere in the United States and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Exporting rationed goods, misdemeanor.

Section 1. The exportation from the Territory of any food or any article or commodity which is or may be rationed in the United States, except such as is produced, manufactured, canned or preserved within the Territory, shall be unlawful; and any person who sells, barter, delivers, purchases, receives or possesses any such goods with intent to transport or cause the transportation thereof out of the Territory, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1000 or by imprisonment for not more than one year, or both. In any

prosecution under this Act, the following shall be deemed prima facie violations:

(a) The possession of food or stores in excess of ordinary requirements aboard any vessel, vehicle, or aircraft leaving or about to leave the Territory; Prima facie violations.

(b) The sale to and the purchase or possession of food by any person who is not a resident of or is about to leave the Territory, except for personal consumption in such quantities as shall not be in excess of immediate requirements.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of every person engaged in the production, manufacture, sale or transportation of any article of food or merchandise which is or may be rationed to refuse to sell, or transport such goods in every case in which he has reason to suspect an attempt to violate this Act, or to facilitate the violation, circumvention or evasion of the rationing laws and regulations as aforesaid. Duty certain class persons.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency.

## CHAPTER 33.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 31]

To amend Section 4671, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relative to insane persons.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Section 4671, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be amended by striking out the word "male" in the second line of Column 2 of said Section. Amended.
