

CHAPTER 5.

AN ACT

[S. B. 13]

To amend Section 3197, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relating to Vital Statistics, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Amended.

Section 1. That Section 3197, Chapter 63 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933 be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Birth
Certificate
Form.

“Sec. 3197. STANDARD FORMS USED. The certificate and record of birth shall be of the standard form approved by the United States Bureau of the Census and shall be filed and recorded in all cases where the period of gestation has reached or passed the twenty-fourth week, and shall contain a statement of the place of birth; date of birth; full name of child (the given name to be added by a supplementary statement if the child is not named at the time of making the record); sex; whether a plural birth, (twin, triplet, etc.); full name of father; residence, color or race, birthplace, age and occupation of father; maiden name, residence, color or race, birthplace, age and occupation of mother, number of children of mother, and number of children living; whether born at full term and if not giving the period of gestation if twenty-four weeks or more; whether still-born or born alive; and the physician or midwife in attendance upon the birth, or in the absence of a physician or midwife, the parent, householder, or owner of the premises, manager or superintendent of institution, captain of vessel, or other competent person having knowledge or cognizance of the birth, shall fill out on blanks furnished for the purpose, or in the absence of such blanks, on paper written in ink with a pen or typewriter, the certificate and record required by the provisions of this

section and shall sign the same with his or her signature and forward it within ten days after such birth to the United States Commissioner for the precinct in which the birth occurs; provided, that when it is impossible to secure any of the information required upon the blank, the item may be followed by the word "unknown."

Proviso.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 6.

AN ACT

[S. B. 8]

To regular and control the manufacture, possession, sale, prescription, administering, dispensing and compounding of narcotic drugs, providing penalties for the violation of any provision thereof and repealing Sections 1270, 1271, 1273, 1274 and 1275, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. DEFINITIONS. The following words and phrases, as used in this Act, shall have the following meanings, unless the context otherwise requires:

Drugs.

(1) "Person" includes any corporation, association, co-partnership, or one or more individuals.

Definitions.

(2) "Physician" means a person authorized by law to practice medicine in this territory and any other person authorized by law to treat sick and injured human beings in this territory and to use narcotic drugs
