

All payments required under this law shall be made in the same manner as all other Territorial funds are disbursed.

Penalties.

Section 15. PROTECTION AGAINST FRAUD. Any person who shall wilfully or knowingly make any false statement, or shall falsify or permit to be falsified any record or records of this Retirement System, shall be guilty of misdemeanor and on conviction thereof in any Court of competent jurisdiction, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, or imprisonment not to exceed six months, or both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court, and shall forfeit all rights under this Act.

Saving clause.

Section 16. CONSTITUTIONALITY. If any section or part of any section of this Act shall be declared unconstitutional, the remainder of the Act shall not thereby be invalidated. All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

Appropriation.

Section 17. APPROPRIATION FOR INITIAL ESTABLISHMENT. For the initial establishment of said Teachers' Retirement System, there is hereby appropriated the sum of Twenty-five Hundred Dollars (\$2500.00).

CHAPTER 18**AN ACT**

[H. B. 67]

To appropriate the sum of \$280.00 to reimburse Ralph A. Treffers for his expenses in providing transportation for students on the Eagle River Route to and from the Tee Harbor Territorial School from January 17, 1944, to May 19, 1944, inclusive; and to declare

an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the sum of \$280.00 is hereby appropriated out of the moneys in the Treasury of the Territory not otherwise appropriated to reimburse Ralph A. Treffers for his expenses in providing transportation for students on the Eagle River Route to and from the Tee Harbor Territorial School, near Juneau, Alaska, from January 17, 1944, to May 19, 1944, inclusive.

Section 2. Payments under this appropriation shall be made upon vouchers approved by the Commissioner of Education and the Auditor of Alaska.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 19

AN ACT

[H. B. 38]

To amend Section 5053, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, by providing for consecutive sentences in the case of convictions for two or more crimes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

SECTION 1. Section 5053, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following provision:

“If the defendant is convicted of two or more
