And if the defendant be in imprisonment upon a previous judgment on a conviction for a crime, the judgment may be that the imprisonment may commence at the expiration of the term limited by such previous judgments.”

CHAPTER 20

AN ACT

[S. B. 42]

To amend sub-section (a) (3) of Section 10 of Chapter 4 of the Extraordinary Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, as amended by Chapters 1 and 51, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, as amended by Chapter 40, Session Laws of Alaska, 1941, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That sub-division (a) (3) of Section 10 of Chapter 4 of the Extraordinary Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, as amended by Chapters 1 and 51, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, as amended by Chapter 40, Session Laws of Alaska, 1941, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 10 (a) (3). The Commission shall appoint a director who shall be the chief executive of the Commission, whose compensation shall be Five Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$5,250.00) per annum, payable in equal monthly installments; he shall be appointed for

a term of four years and may be removed at the pleasure of the Commission. No person shall be appointed Director unless he is a citizen of the United States, a resident of this Territory and has been such resident at least five years immediately preceding his appointment. The Director shall be subject to the supervision and direction of the Commission and shall perform such duties as the Commission may assign to him."

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist ^{Emergency.} and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 21

Amending Sections 1792 and 1795 Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, as amended by Chapter 5 Sections 2 and 5 Session Laws of Alaska 1937, relative to burial of indigents; and setting rates for such burials.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 1792 Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, as amended by Chapter 5 Section 2 Extraordinary Session Laws of Alaska 1937, is hereby amended to read as follows:
