

CHAPTER 23

AN ACT

[S. B. 18]

Authorizing the Territorial Highway Engineer to erect and maintain shelter cabins and comfort stations on airports throughout the Territory and equip same, making it a misdemeanor to deface or destroy such cabins, comfort stations or equipment and prescribing penalties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The Territorial Highway Engineer is hereby authorized to erect and maintain shelter cabins and comfort stations for the accommodation of travelers on such airports throughout the Territory where, in his discretion, such facilities are required and necessary, out of funds appropriated for the construction and maintenance of roads and aviation fields. Each shelter cabin or comfort station, so constructed, shall be provided with a suitable stove and such other facilities as said Territorial Highway Engineer shall deem necessary.

Section 2. The cabins, stoves and other facilities provided for in this chapter shall be the property of the Territory of Alaska, and any person who shall wilfully remove, destroy or deface any such cabin, or any part thereof, or any stove or other facilities contained therein or pertinent thereto, or who shall occupy such cabin for any length of time other than that necessary and incident to ordinary travel, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this chapter, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred or more than five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the federal jail for not less than three months or more than one year, or both such fine and imprisonment.
