

made under authority of this Act, or sells seeds failing to meet all of the labeling requirements, standards and tests as provided for by regulation of the Commissioner shall, upon conviction thereof be punished for each such offense by a fine of not more than \$1,000, or by imprisonment for not more than one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Penalties.

Section 4. Such amounts as the Legislature may from time to time deem necessary to carry out the provisions and to accomplish the purposes of this Act are hereby authorized to be appropriated and made available to the Department of Agriculture out of any monies in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated. There is hereby appropriated for the period ending March 31, 1947 the sum of \$37,500 for the Department of Agriculture out of any monies in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated. Appropriation.

Section 5. If any provision of this Act or the application of such provision to any person or circumstances shall be held invalid, the validity of the remainder of the Act and the applicability of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby. Saving clause.

Section 6. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency.

## CHAPTER 42

### AN ACT

[H. B. 25]

To appropriate the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars to cover a deficiency in the appropriation for Entertainment at the Gov-

ernor's Mansion, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Deficiency  
Entertainment,  
Governor.

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, to cover expenses incurred under the appropriation Entertainment at the Governor's Mansion in excess of the amount appropriated in 1943.

Emergency.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 43

### AN ACT

[S. H. B. 32]

To amend Section 4811, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relating to receiving stolen property.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Section 4811, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be amended to read as follows:

Amended to add  
"embezzled."

"Sec. 4811. Every person who buys, receives or conceals any money, goods, bank notes, or other things which may be the subject of larceny and which has been feloniously taken, embezzled or stolen from any other person, knowing the same to have been so taken, embezzled, or stolen, shall be punished by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars and by imprisonment not more than three years."
