CHAPTER 56

AN ACT

[S. B. 50]

To amend Chapter 65 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, relating to the establishment of a Territorial Board of Accountancy, defining its powers and providing a penalty for the unlawful use of titles and degrees, by amending Sections 2 and 5.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 2, Chapter 65, of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, be amended to read as follows:

Appointment
of members.

Term of office—
How appointed.

Vacancy.

“Section 2. The first three members of the Board shall be appointed by the Governor of Alaska within thirty days after the date on which this Act becomes effective, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient. Of the members so appointed, one shall hold office for the period of two years from and after January 1, 1937, one for four years after said date, and one for six years after said date, and until the appointment of their successors. Each second year the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislature shall appoint one member of the Board who shall serve for a term of six years and until his successor shall have been appointed. A vacancy on the Board shall be filled by the Governor by appointment for the unexpired term, subject, however, to confirmation by the Legislature when the Legislature shall next

again be in session, after the date of such appointment. The appointment of a member of the Board to fill a vacancy on the Board shall be in all respects valid and effective unless and until the Legislature shall refuse to confirm such appointment. Each Person appointed as a member of the Board, whether for a full term or for an unexpired term, must take and pass the written examination prescribed by the American Institute of Accountants in the rules of the Board of Examiners of that Institute approved June 13, 1922, or as may be altered from time to time by the Council of said American Institute of Accountants, and if any person appointed a member of the Board fails to pass said examination, and file adequate proof of the Governor within six (6) months after his appointment of having passed said examination, the position of said member shall immediately be declared vacant by the Governor. After any member appointed on the Board has filed adequate proof from the Board of Examiners of the American Institute of Accountants of having passed the examination prescribed by that Institute no other or further examination of said member shall be necessary, but said new member may be reappointed from time to time thereafter in the discretion of the Governor, and in the manner hereinabove provided."

Section 2. That Section 5, Chapter 65, of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 5. Written examinations shall be held at the times and according to the rules and regulations prescribed by the American Institute of Accountants in the rules of the Board of Examiners of that Institute approved June 13, 1922, or as may be altered from time to time by the

Designation of tests to be given.

Council of said American Institute of Accountants, and in such places as may be selected by the Board. The written examinations of applicants shall be those prescribed by the American Institute of Accountants in the rules of the Board of Examiners of that Institute approved June 13, 1922, or as may be altered from time to time by the Council of said American Institute of Accountants. The Board shall make the necessary arrangements with the Council of the American Institute of Accountants to grade the answers of the candidates and the grading of the answers must be accepted by the Board as final. Provided, however, that in any case the person wishing to take the examination resides in a place remote from a meeting place of the Board, the examination of such person must be given under the supervision of some reliable person, not a member of the Board, of good standing in the community in which he resides, such examiner to be appointed by the Board and approved by the Attorney General of the Territory of Alaska. In such cases the Board shall make proper rules and regulations to insure a fair and proper examination. The answers of the person or persons so examined shall, upon close of the examination be immediately sealed up by the examiner and forthwith transmitted to the Board of Examiners of the American Institute of Accountants for grading with instructions to transmit the grades of the person examined to the Board. Nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to prevent one member of the Board from giving examinations under directions of and with consent of the Board, but all examination papers shall be finally graded by the Board of Examiners of the American Institute of Accountants."
