CHAPTER 7

AN ACT

[S. B. 26]

To provide for the payment of salaries to certain Members of the Territorial Legislature, Seventeenth Session, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Salaries of
Legislators

Section 1. That the sum of One Hundred and Sixty-five (\$165.00) Dollars, is hereby appropriated for the payment of salaries, in the amounts herein specified, to the following Members of the Seventeenth Session of the Territorial Legislature: Senator Don Carlos Brownell, \$105.00; Representative Clayton A. Pollard, \$30.00; Representative Walter E. Huntley, \$30.00.

Emergency.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 8

AN ACT

[S. B. 2]

To amend Chapter 4 of the Extraordinary Session Laws of Alaska,

1937, as amended by Chapters 1 and 51, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, as amended by Chapter 40, Session Laws of Alaska 1941, relating to the Unemployment Compensation Law, by amending Sections 2 (h) (1), 2 (h) (2) repealing Section 2 (h) (3), 2 (h) (4), 2 (h) (5) and 2 (h) (6) by adding paragraph (J) to subsection 2 (i) (6) and providing for a savings clause.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Chapter 4, Section 2 (h), Extraordinary Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, as amended by Chapters 1 and 51, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, as amended by Chapter 40, Session Laws of Alaska, 1941, be amended to read as follows:

Section 2 (h) "Employer" means:

(1) On and after July 1, 1945 any employing unit which for some portion of a day, has or had in employment one or more individuals; and

(2) For the effective period of its election pursuant to Section 8, any other employing unit, otherwise excluded from the Act, which has elected to become subject to this Act.

Section 2. That Chapter 4, Section 2, Extraordinary Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, as amended by Chapters 1 and 51, Session Laws of Alaska 1939, as amended by Chapter 40, Session Laws of Alaska, 1941, be amended by adding a new paragraph to be known as Section 2 (i) (6) (J).

Section 2 (i) (6) (J) Casual labor not in the course of an employer's trade or business (labor which does not promote or advance the trade or business of the employer). Temporary labor in the usual course of an employer's trade or business shall not be deemed to be casual labor.

Section 3. All penalties, forfeitures and liabilities heretofore existing prior to the foregoing amendment, whether civil or criminal in nature, shall not be affected thereby, but all suits, proceedings or prosecutions, whether civil or criminal, for causes arising, or acts done or committed prior to said amendment, may be commenced and prosecuted as if said amendment had not been made.

CHAPTER 9

AN ACT

[H. B. 23]

To amend Section 1431, Article I, Chapter 17 of Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, by changing the date of the general election from the month of September as now provided for, to the second Tuesday in October, 1946, and every second year thereafter.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 1431, Article 1, Chapter 17 of Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is hereby, amended to read as follows:

“Section 1431. A general election for members of the Legislature, the Delegate to Congress and other officers of the Territory shall be held on the second Tuesday in October, 1946, and every second year thereafter on the second Tuesday in October: Provided, the Legislature shall have power from time to time, as the need therefor may arise, to change the date of general elections in the Territory, including the date of election of a Delegate from the Territory to the House of Representatives and of the members of the
