

SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 11

TO THE HIGHWAY ENGINEER AND THE TERRITORIAL BOARD
OF ROAD COMMISSIONERS:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in its Seventeenth Regular Session assembled, respectfully represents that:

WHEREAS, all available building sites in the village of Dillingham, Alaska have been taken up, and

WHEREAS, the land between Dillingham and the village of Aleknagik, a distance of approximately sixteen miles, is ideal for homes, gardens and farms, and

WHEREAS, the sheltered lake at Aleknagik would make an ideal landing place for pontoon airplanes when the river tides and weather will not permit pontoon landing at Dillingham, and

WHEREAS, the 1939 Legislature of the Territory of Alaska appropriated Ten Thousand Dollars for the purpose of building this road from Dillingham to Aleknagik but for some reason such funds were never used as directed,

NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist respectfully petitions and prays that the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners will take steps to complete the construction of such a road from Dillingham to Aleknagik.

SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 12

TO THE HIGHWAY ENGINEER AND THE TERRITORIAL BOARD
OF ROAD COMMISSIONERS:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in its Seventeenth Regular Session assembled, respectfully represents that:

WHEREAS, there now exists a road of five and one-quarter miles between the village of Dillingham, Alaska, and the U. S. I. O. Hospital at Kanakanak, Alaska; and

WHEREAS, there are seventy-one families living in Dillingham, twenty-seven families living along this five and one-quarter mile road and twenty-five families residing at Kanakanak; and

WHEREAS, the landing field and lake is at Dillingham proper and all business concerns are located in Dillingham; and

WHEREAS, the radio station is located at the U. S. I. O. Hospital at Kanakanak; and

WHEREAS, the U. S. I. O. Hospital serving the entire Bristol Bay area is located at Kanakanak; and

WHEREAS, all patients coming to the Kanakanak Hospital must land at Dillingham in winter only to find that dog team transportation is the only means of reaching the hospital; and

WHEREAS, discharged patients of the hospital must come in to Dillingham to be ready for and await transportation back to their homes; and

WHEREAS, there are no high school grades at the Kanakanak School and present pupils are required to come to Dillingham by dog team or find a place to board in Dillingham; and

WHEREAS, there are no means at the present time by which this Dillingham-Kanakanak Road can be kept open during the winter months;

NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist respectfully petitions and prays that the sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars be appropriated for the use in keeping the road between Dillingham, Alaska and Kanakanak, Alaska, open the year round for the use of any and all Bristol Bay patients entering and leaving the U. S. I. O. Kanakanak Hospital, and so that high school pupils may attend the Snag Point Territorial School at Dillingham, Alaska.
