

SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 19

TO THE HIGHWAY ENGINEER AND THE TERRITORIAL BOARD
OF ROAD COMMISSIONERS:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in its Seventeenth Regular Session assembled, respectfully represents that:

WHEREAS, the development of Alaska depends to a considerable degree upon aviation throughout the Territory; and

WHEREAS, certain airports on the Seward Peninsula, serving well established communities, are now in a dangerous condition.

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist respectfully petitions and prays that the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners take steps, as soon as possible, to improve the airports at White Mountain, Golovin and Haycock, and to expend the necessary funds for that purpose from the funds provided and appropriated by the Legislature for the construction of public roads and airports.

SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 20

TO THE CIVIL AERONAUTICS BOARD, WASHINGTON, D. C.:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in Seventeenth Session assembled, respectfully submits that:

WHEREAS, in granting certificates of authority for the operation of airlines connecting Alaska with the continental United States, the Civil Aeronautics Board is largely governed by the benefit derived therefrom by the general public; and

WHEREAS, the principle that competition is the life of trade should continue to play its fair part in this as in other fields of endeavor to a reasonable extent; and

WHEREAS, it is the universal opinion that Alaska will be the scene of great development immediately after the cessation of hostilities and that air transportation will play an important role therein; and

WHEREAS, such development will assure the profitable operation of many lines of air service between this Territory and the continental United States:

NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist respectfully expresses the considered opinion that Alaska offers ample opportunity for the profitable operation of one or more airlines on each route connecting the continental United States with the Territory, and prays that certificates of authority be granted to responsible Alaskan lines now under consideration by the Board.

SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 21

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR, TO THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, TO THE SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE, TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON TERRITORIES AND INSULAR AFFAIRS, TO THE HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE, TO THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON TERRITORIES, AND TO THE DELEGATE TO CONGRESS FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in Seventeenth Regular Session assembled, respectfully represents that:

WHEREAS, all of the judicial power of the Territory is vested in four Federal District Courts; and

WHEREAS, no inferior courts are provided for under the Organic Act of the Territory except that it provides for the appointment of commissioners to exercise generally powers ordinarily delegated to the county and municipal courts; and
