SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 3

TO THE HONORABLE THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES, TO THE HONORABLE HENRY L. STIMSON, SECRETARY OF WAR AND TO THE HONORABLE E. L. BARTLETT, DELEGATE TO CONGRESS FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully represents that:

WHEREAS, the community of Tenakee, Tenakee Inlet, Alaska is the center of a large fishing area and is utilized by a large number of fishermen; and

WHEREAS, there is no harbor or safe anchorage at or near said Tenakee and on account thereof those operating in the waters adjacent thereto are required, on the approach of severe and sudden storms, to run for shelter to distant ports, all of which entails great risk of loss of life and property as well as heavy expense; NOW THEREFORE

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska in Seventeenth Session assembled, respectfully urges that the United States Government improve the harbor and build a breakwater at Tenakee, Alaska, as soon after World War II as it can reasonably be done.
