

## Senate Joint Resolutions

---

### SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1

WHEREAS: on November 13, 1942, the Congress of the United States amended the Organic Act of the Territory of Alaska and provided for increased membership in the Senate and House of Representatives in the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska but required the Territory to assume responsibility for the expenses of the said Legislature except the payment of per diem and traveling expenses of the members of the Legislature in the manner that such per diem and traveling expenses had heretofore been paid; and

WHEREAS: there is no present provision of the Law authorizing any agency of the Federal or Territorial Government to incur any expenses for printing, supplies, or otherwise, for the use of the Territorial Legislature and in connection with its business:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Seventeenth Session of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the House concurring, that a joint committee consisting of the Printing Committee of the Senate and the Printing Committee of the House be authorized and directed to call for bids for the printing of two hundred (200) copies of the advance sheets of each Law as filed with the Secretary of the Territory, for five hundred (500) bound volumes of all Laws passed by the Legislature of 1945, for the printing of the Journal of the House and the Senate respectively, and for all supplies needed by the said Legislature in its 1945 Session.

### SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 3

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

1. That the sum of \$16,400.00, or so much thereof as shall be found necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any monies in the

Treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated for the payment of salaries to persons employed by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska during the present session, said sum to be apportioned according to the following schedules:

- (A) For the salaries of the chief clerk of the House of Representatives and Secretary of the Senate, \$8.00 per day, assistant secretary of the Senate, assistant clerk of the House of Representatives, enrolling clerks, engrossing clerks, sergeants-at-arms, doorkeepers, messengers, and watchmen, at \$5.00 per day, the sum of .....\$5,160.00.
- (B) As additional compensation for services rendered by the chief clerk of the House of Representatives and Secretary of the Senate, \$4.00 per day; for the assistant clerk of the House of Representatives and assistant secretary of the Senate, \$6.00 per day, for the enrolling clerks, engrossing clerks, sergeants-at-arms, doorkeepers, messengers, and watchmen, in excess of regular working hours and for work done on week-ends and holidays, \$4.00 per day, the sum of .....\$6,200.00.
- (C) For salaries of the clerks to the Judiciary Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives \$11.00 per day each, and three additional clerks for the House of Representatives and Senate at \$9.00 per day each; and for salaries of the chaplains of the Senate and House of Representatives, at \$4.00 per day each, the sum of .....\$5,040.00.

2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Committee on Territorial Offices and Institutions in the Senate and the Committee on Territorial Institutions in the House of Representatives be and they are hereby authorized and directed to provide for the transportation of a committee from the Senate and a committee from the House of Representatives from Juneau, Alaska, to Sitka and return, said committees to inspect and examine the Pioneers Home at Sitka, Alaska, and report to the Legislature their findings and recommendations. That for the purpose of defraying the cost of transportation of said committee there is hereby appropriated the sum of Nine Hundred Dollars, or so much as may be necessary, for such purpose.

3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives are author-

ized to employ for such number of hours per day and for such compensation as to them shall seem necessary and reasonable, a janitor and charwoman, to clean, care for and keep in proper order the rooms occupied by the Legislature, and for the purpose of paying the wages of such janitor and charwoman there is hereby appropriated the sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.

4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives are hereby authorized and directed to secure necessary telephone service for use of the Legislature, at and during the present session thereof and there is hereby appropriated the sum of Fifty Dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the payment of such telephone service.

5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives are hereby authorized and directed to purchase such necessary supplies as they shall deem necessary for the use of the present Legislature, and the sum of One Thousand Dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the payment thereof.

The monies hereby appropriated shall be paid by warrants drawn on the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska upon vouchers approved by the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives; and

6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage.

### SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 5

WHEREAS, George Daniels of Juneau, Alaska, was injured at the mine of the Alaska Juneau Gold Mining Company at Juneau on June 25, 1940, whereby he lost the sight of both eyes; and

WHEREAS, the said Alaska Juneau Gold Mining Company has paid the said George Daniels the sum of \$5,000.00 in accordance with the Workmen's Compensation Laws of the Territory; and
