

ticular trade, occupation, process or employment, and to exclude all ordinary diseases of life to which the general public are exposed; including, also, any injury caused by the wilful act of a third person directed against the employees because of his or her employment, but shall not include injuries caused by the employee's wilful intention to injure himself or herself or to injure another or caused by his or her wilful intoxication.

Section 39. TITLE OF ACT. This Act shall be cited as "The Workmen's Compensation Act of Alaska."

Section 40. SEPARABILITY OF PROVISIONS. If any provision of this Act, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Act, and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby. ^{Saving clause.}

Section 41. LAWS REPEALED. This Act shall supersede and repeal all other laws of the Territory relating to Workmen's Compensation, and Section 2161 to Section 2203, inclusive, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, as amended by Chapter 84, Session Laws of Alaska 1935, Chapter 74, Session Laws of Alaska 1937, Chapter 49, Session Laws of Alaska 1939, Chapter 44, Session Laws of Alaska 1941, and Chapter 63, Session Laws of Alaska 1937, are specifically repealed. ^{Repeal section.}

CHAPTER 10

AN ACT

[S. B. 28]

To provide additional revenue for the Territory of Alaska; amend-

ing Section 3138 (h), Compiled Laws of Alaska (1933), relating to license taxes on fish traps and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Case tax.

Section 1. That during the year 1946 any person, firm or corporation engaging in the business of salmon canning in this Territory shall pay, in addition to all other taxes now payable under existing law, the following additional tax:

On all King, red or sockeye salmon packed 10c per case of 48 1-lb. cans, or its equivalent.

On all other species of salmon packed 4c per case of 48 1-lb. cans or its equivalent.

Case tax, how and when paid.

Section 2. The tax above provided shall accrue, become due and payable, and be collected in the same manner as all other taxes on canned salmon are now collected and paid under the existing laws of the Territory, and failure to pay the same shall subject the person, firm or corporation liable therefor, to the penalties now provided by law for failure to pay other taxes now levied upon similar products.

Section 3. Section 3138 (h), Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Fish trap tax, graduated scale.

(h) Fish Traps: hand driven or stake traps located on tide lands, Seventy-Five Dollars per annum. Pile driven or floating traps, Three Hundred Dollars per annum, so called dummy traps included; and an additional tax of Four Dollars per one thousand fish caught in any one trap in excess of one hundred thousand. In addition to the above tax, any person, firm or corporation occupying and operating more than three traps shall pay an additional \$100.00

per trap for the fourth to tenth trap inclusive, and an additional \$200.00 per trap for all over ten traps.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 11

AN ACT

[S. B. 21]

To provide for the making of a survey of all hospitals and health center facilities in the Territory of Alaska; and making an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Hospital Survey. The Department of Health of the Territory of Alaska is hereby empowered to:

(a) Make a survey of the location, size, and character of all existing public and private (proprietary as well as non-profit) hospitals and health centers in the Territory of Alaska; Survey of hospitals.

(b) Evaluate the sufficiency of such hospitals and health centers to supply the necessary physical facilities for furnishing adequate hospital, clinic and similar services to all of the people of the Territory of Alaska; and,
