

bonded or other indebtedness shall be considered expenses for maintenance within the meaning of this article.

Sec. 1332. Amount of refund how determined. Where the total resident school enrollment by school year is less than 150 pupils, eighty five per centum and where it is 150 pupils or over and less than 300, eighty per centum and where it is 300 pupils or over, seventy five per centum of the total amount expended for maintenance of public elementary schools and high schools within the limits of incorporated cities or incorporated school districts or independent school districts shall be refunded to such city or school district from the moneys of the Territory appropriated for such purposes.

Refund determined by number of pupils.

Section 2. This Act will become effective as of July 1, 1946.

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## CHAPTER 13

### AN ACT

[S. B. 27]

To provide a supplemental appropriation for Health and Sanitation for the biennium ending March 31, 1947, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That there is hereby appropriated out of any monies in the Treasury, not otherwise appropriated,

the sum of \$15,729.83 or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the expenses of the Department of Health, for the period ending March 31, 1947, said sum to be apportioned according to the following schedule:

Administration, Department of Health, including salaries, travel expenses, clerical assistance, office equipment and contingent office expense, commissioner's salary, .....	\$8,455.00
Sanitation .....	7,274.83
Total .....	<u>\$15,729.83</u>

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 14

### AN ACT

[S. B. 33]

Authorizing the Commissioner of Education to travel to Washington, D. C. and return, and for other purposes as defined in this Act, at Territorial expense; and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. Pursuant to representations by the Board of Education that it would be highly advantageous to the Territory to allow the Commissioner of Education to proceed to Washington, D. C. for the purpose of securing from the Department of the Interior of the United States, a contract under which the Federal
