Legislature.

Section 5. BIENNIAL REPORT. A full report of the rehabilitation activities of the Territorial Board of Vocational Education shall be rendered biennially to the Legislature, this report to include a record of all gifts and donations offered and accepted.

Appropriation.

Section 6. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated, the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary. This money and all other funds made available hereunder, shall be under the jurisdiction of the Territorial Board of Vocational Education and shall be used by it in carrying on the rehabilitation program in accordance with the provisions of this Act and the provisions of the aforesaid Act of Congress. Disbursements hereunder shall be by Territorial warrants on vouchers approved by a duly authorized administrative officer.

Section 7. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 16

AN ACT

[S. B. 34]

To appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 to purchase additional radio-telephone and other necessary equipment for the Alaska Aeronautics and Communications Commission; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$20,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the Alaska Aeronautics and Communications Commission to purchase additional radiotelephone and other equipment necessary for establishment of radiotelephone stations, or the relocation or re-equipping of such stations already established, as may be deemed necessary or advisable by the Commission.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 17

AN ACT

[S. B. 15]

To prescribe the qualifications of police officers of cities of the first class.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Every person who seeks the position of police officer of a city of the first class must before qualifying for said office have passed a written examination upon the following subjects: The Constitution of the United States, the territorial laws relating to arrests in criminal cases, the issuance and execution of search warrants and the ordinances of the city in which he is to serve.
