For continuous travel of less than twenty-four hours, however, constituting a travel period, such period will be regarded as commencing with the beginning of the travel and ending with the completion thereof and for each six-hour period or fraction thereof, one-fourth of the rate for a calendar day will be allowed, provided that no per diem will be allowed when the departure is after 8:00 A. M. and the return on the same day is prior to 6:00 P. M.; or for any absence not exceeding three hours.

CHAPTER 21

AN ACT

[H. B. 31]

To amend Chapter 57 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, relating to payment of Election Judges and Clerks, increasing same, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 1 of Chapter 57, Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. That Section 1505 Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto, the following:

Provided, however, that in all precincts in the Territory of Alaska, the Judges and Clerks of Election shall receive a compensation of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per day.

CHAPTER 22

AN ACT

[H. B. 35]

For payment of deficiency obligations under Sections 585 to 588, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, pertaining to Bounty on Eagles, which obligations were incurred prior to repeal thereof by Ch. 31, Session Laws of Alaska, 1945; making an appropriation; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred and Sixty-One Dollars (\$1,561.00) out of the general funds in the Territorial Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to cover claims for Eagle bounties accrued under Section 585 to 588, inclusive, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, and approved by the Treasurer, prior to repeal of said Sections by Ch. 31, Session Laws of Alaska, 1945.
