

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 1, Chapter 41 Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, as amended by Chapter 68, Session Laws of Alaska, 1941, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. Bounty on Wolves or Coyotes. There is hereby placed upon every wild lobo or timber wolf and every wild coyote or prairie wolf, legally taken within the Territory bounties of Thirty Dollars on wolves and Twenty-five Dollars on coyotes, said sums to be paid in accordance with provisions hereof.

Bounty, \$30.00 on wolves, \$25.00 on coyotes.

Section 2. To carry out the provisions hereof, the sum of \$60,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the biennium ending March 31, 1947.

CHAPTER 25

AN ACT

[H. B. 21]

To amend Chapter 55, Session Laws of Alaska, 1945, by transferring from certain officers to the Department of Taxation, the authority to collect certain taxes; to amend Section 3143 Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, and repealing Section 3148 Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Sub-section (a) (2) of Section 10 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1945, is hereby amended by

adding a period after the word "Commissioner" on the last line of said sub-section and eliminating the language "as of April 1, 1945." immediately ensuing.

Section 2. Sub-section (b) of Section 10 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1945, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

Taxes to be
collected by Tax
Commissioner.

(9) License taxes of junk dealers and metal scrappers levied by Chapter 24, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939;

(10) license taxes of collection agencies, collection bureaus, and collection offices levied by Chapter 22, Session Laws of Alaska, 1941;

(11) license taxes imposed on all persons engaged in the digging of clams for commercial use, levied by Chapter 8, Session Laws of Alaska, 1935;

(12) tax on motor fuel oil, levied by Chapter 47, Session Laws of Alaska, 1945;

(13) license taxes of certified public accountants levied by Section 7, Chapter 65, Session Laws of Alaska, 1937;

(14) license taxes collected for the issuance of vehicle operators' licenses levied under the authority of Sections 1 and 6 of Chapter 65, Session Laws of Alaska, 1941.

(15) Fees collected under and the purposes of Chapter 61 of the Session Laws of Alaska 1945, which provides for the issuance of motor vehicle certificates of ownership.

Section 3. Section 3143 Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, is hereby amended by substituting the words "Tax

Commissioner" for the word "Auditor" as it appears immediately after the word "the" at the beginning of the second sentence of said section.

Section 4. Section 3148 Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, which directs the Auditor to prescribe and distribute tax collection forms is hereby repealed. Tax Commissioner to prescribe form.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency clause.

CHAPTER 26

AN ACT

[S. B. 26]

Relating to provision of a suitable Motorship for Public Health clinical purposes; appropriating money derived from sale of the "HYGIENE" and deposited in the Treasury; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of money in the Treasury for the purchase, alteration and repair of a motorship for use of the Health Department as a mobile health clinic in fostering the public health, such amount as is derived from the sale of the "HYGIENE" and deposited in the Territorial Treasury. Appropriation for purchase of boat.

Section 2. This appropriation shall become effective in the sum indicated at the time of deposit as above provided. Emergency clause.
