request of the prisoner, or any relative or friend of such prisoner, visit the person so arrested, and it shall be unlawful for any officer having custody of a person so arrested to wilfully refuse or neglect to allow such attorney to visit such person without delay.

Penalty for
violation.

Any violation hereof shall be deemed to be a misdemeanor, and upon conviction of the offender, he shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or imprisonment for not more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. In addition to such criminal liability, any officer having a prisoner in custody who refuses to allow an attorney to visit the prisoner when proper application is made therefor, shall forfeit and pay to the party aggrieved the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Emergency
clause.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 37

AN ACT

[H. B. 54]

To amend Section 1, as amended by Ch. 30, Session Laws of Alaska, 1941, and Section 2 of Ch. 77, Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, relating to the establishment and maintenance of Territorial Assay Offices.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 1 of Ch. 77, Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, as amended by Ch. 30, Session Laws of Alaska, 1941, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. For the purpose of aiding bona fide miners and prospectors and stimulating mineral discoveries, the Commissioner of Mines is empowered and directed to establish public assay offices in the Territory of Alaska, to be located at Ketchikan, Alaska, College, Alaska, Nome, Alaska, and Anchorage, Alaska. The Commissioner of Mines shall be empowered to fix and prescribe all rules, regulations and procedures deemed necessary and expedient for fulfilling the provisions of this Act.

Assay office established.

Section 2. Section 2 of Ch. 77, Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. The Commissioner of Mines shall appoint for each office a competent person to make assays and analyses of Alaska ores and minerals; when such assays or analyses are made on Alaskan ores or minerals, no charge shall be imposed for the making thereof; when any assay or analysis is made on ores or minerals which do not originate in the Territory of Alaska, there shall be collected therefor the same fee charged by United States Assay Offices for similar services; provided, that the assays and analyses on Alaskan samples shall have precedence and shall be made in chronological order; and provided further, that it shall not be necessary to disclose the precise location in Alaska which is the origin of any ore or mineral submitted for assay or analysis, or any other

information concerning the same, except its Alaska origin.

CHAPTER 38

AN ACT

[H. B. 53]

To amend Section 2 of Chapter 41, Session Laws of Alaska, 1945, by empowering the Commissioner of Agriculture to promulgate regulations pertaining to the grading, inspection and labeling of potatoes to be marketed for consumption.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 2 of Chapter 41, Session Laws of Alaska, 1945, is hereby amended by adding thereto at the end thereof the following provision:

“As to potatoes sold or offered for sale for general consumption, the Commissioner of Agriculture shall have power to make and promulgate rules, regulations and procedures requiring their classification, grading and inspection prior to any sale thereof, and requiring the marking or labeling of any sack, box, carton or other device containing such potatoes to show the kind, grade or other prescribed classification of the potatoes therein contained.”
