(c) Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Act or any rule or regulation promulgated hereunder, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500.00, or imprisonment for not more than ONE year, and each day that such person continues any such violation shall be deemed a separate offense.

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CHAPTER 5

AN ACT

[S. B. 22]

Establishing Department of Health Surplus Property Fund for purchase and resale of surplus medical supplies and equipment; making an appropriation; and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Purchase of surplus medical supplies.

Section 1. POLICY. It is the intention of the Legislature by this Act to make available to the use of the people of Alaska, at the authorized discount, a substantial amount of the medical equipment and supplies now or hereafter declared surplus property in Alaska by the armed forces of the United States.

Section 2. ADMINISTRATION. It shall be the duty

of the Commissioner of Health under rules of the Board of Health and in compliance with law, to carry out the intent and purpose of this Act and to administer the revolving fund hereinafter authorized and established.

Commissioner of Health to carry out Act.

Section 3. REVOLVING FUND. There is hereby created the Department of Health Surplus Property Fund to be composed of the money hereinafter appropriated.

Revolving fund created.

Section 4. USE OF FUND. The fund may be used for the purchase by the Department of Health from the Armed Forces of the United States such surplus medical supplies and equipment at the authorized discount and to distribute such supplies and equipment by the sale thereof to such points in the Territory as will advance this Territory's health program. Sale of such equipment and supplies as may be acquired by the Health Department hereunder shall be made to such individuals, associations, agencies or institutions as may now be or may hereafter become eligible under the Federal Surplus Property Act to purchase such supplies. Such sales will be at a price and on such terms and conditions as will best serve the interest of the Territory, with a view, however, to recovering the money disbursed hereunder to keep this program self-supporting. Disbursements from the fund shall be in the usual manner of disbursing Territorial money. Money recovered from sale of goods hereunder shall be turned over to the Territorial Treasurer for deposit in the Department of Health Surplus Property Fund.

Section 5. TERMINATION OF FUND. The fund set up under this Act will revert to the General Treasury on or before March 31, 1949.

Section 6. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$30,000 for deposit in the Depart-

Section 7. EMERGENCY. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

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## CHAPTER 6

### AN ACT

[S. B. 3]

To amend Section 5, of Chapter 49, Session Laws of Alaska 1945, relating to declaration of ownership of land, and appropriating \$20,000.00 for expenses of the Treasurer and Registers of the District Land Offices in carrying out the Land Registration Program; and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Section 5, of Chapter 49, Session Laws of Alaska 1945, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Register to  
issue vouchers.

Section 5. The register shall not be entitled to any compensation for services rendered by him under this Act. Each register appointed by the Treasurer shall meet the expenses incurred by him hereunder by issuing vouchers in the manner prescribed by law for Territorial Officers. The Territorial Treasurer, on or before the ninetieth day preceding the convening of each regular session of the Legislature, shall submit to the Board of Budget an itemized estimate of appropriations necessary to meet
