

CHAPTER 100

AN ACT

[S. B. 71]

Providing that War Veterans shall be given preference in public employment; defining the term "War Veteran".

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. This Act may be cited as the "Alaska Veterans Preferential Public Employment Act".

Section 2. In every department and upon all public works of the Territory of Alaska, and of any municipal corporation, or other political subdivision thereof, War Veterans shall be preferred for appointment and employment; providing that any such Veteran who makes application for any such position possesses the adequate experience, and business ability to discharge the duties of the position.

Section 3. For the purposes of this Act, the term "War Veteran" or "Veteran" is defined as follows: Every citizen of the United States who has been an actual bona fide resident of the Territory of Alaska, for more than one year prior to his application for a position, and who has been a member of the armed forces of the United States of America and engaged in active service in any war in which this country has been, or may hereafter become engaged, and who has subsequently been discharged therefrom under honorable conditions, is and shall hereafter be deemed a War Veteran.
