

## CHAPTER 101

## AN ACT

[S. B. 82]

Pertaining to Territorial audits; amending Sec. 12-4-2 ACLA 1949;  
and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. Section 12-4-2 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 12-4-2. AUDITS BY AUDITOR: REPORTS OF SAME: RECOMMENDATIONS.

The Auditor of the Territory of Alaska shall audit or cause to be audited by Certified Public Accountant or Accountants, at least once each biennium, the books, accounts and records of every department, officer, board, institution and individual engaged in handling funds of the Territory of Alaska, and shall submit a report of such audits to the Governor of Alaska, who shall submit the said report to the Territorial Legislature at its next regular session within ten days of the opening of the session. The period of such audits shall be on a calendar year basis. With respect to the making of all audits of particular departments, officers, boards or institutions, the Auditor or other persons so authorized shall, in addition to checking fiscal aspects, scrutinize efficiency of administrative methods involved and make recommendations pertaining thereto, and shall provide a copy of the resultant findings and recommendations or report to the Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Senate and the Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee of the

Biennial audit.

Report to Governor.

Examine office methods.

House as representatives of the Legislature for their consideration either during or between sessions.

Emergency  
clause.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

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## CHAPTER 102

### AN ACT

[S. B. 18]

To provide for the survival of a cause of action arising out of personal injury or death after the death of the tort-feasor by amending Sec. 61-7-1 ACLA 1949.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Sec. 61-7-1 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Survival cause of  
action after death  
of wrongdoer.

Sec. 61-7-1. SURVIVAL OF CAUSE OF ACTION ARISING OUT OF INJURY TO PERSON OR DEATH AFTER DEATH OF WRONGDOER. Causes of action arising out of personal injury or death, caused by the wrongful act or negligence of another, shall not abate upon the death of the wrongdoer, and the injured person or the personal representatives of one meeting death, as above stated, shall have a cause of action against the executor, administrator or trustee of the estate of the deceased wrongdoer.
