

CHAPTER 116

AN ACT

[H. B. 71]

To provide for a tax on punchboards; defining offenses and prescribing penalties; and fixing an effective date.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Every distributor who distributes in the Territory of Alaska a punchboard, will pay the following license before the same is sold to the retail trade:

(a) \$2.00 per each board of 2000 holes, or less.

Rate of tax.

(b) \$4.00 per each 1000 holes or fraction thereof, in each board having an excess of 2,000 holes.

Section 2. Such tax shall be paid by purchasing stamps from the office of the Tax Commissioner. Said stamps shall be affixed to the punchboard prior to its being placed in use, and the operator thereof shall endorse upon said stamp the serial number of the punchboard.

Stamps to be affixed.

Section 3. The Tax Commissioner shall have the power to issue all orders, rules and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act.

Section 4. This Act shall not be construed in any way to legalize gambling.

Section 5. Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, fined in any sum not exceeding \$500.00.

Penalty.

Refunds to
municipalities.

Section 6. 75% of the tax on punchboards collected from sales thereof within incorporated cities shall be refunded to such cities and the balance shall be deposited in the general fund of the Territory of Alaska.

Section 7. The effective date of this Act shall be April 1, 1949.

CHAPTER 117

AN ACT

[S. B. 61]

To safeguard the waters of Alaska from pollution, providing for maintenance of standards of purity of the waters of Alaska consistent with public health, public enjoyment of such waters, propagation and protection of fish and wildlife and the industrial development of Alaska, establishing a water pollution control board, defining the duties and powers of said board, providing for the enforcement of water pollution control measures, providing penalties for the violation of this Act, amending Sections 39-2-31 and 39-2-32 of the Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949 and repealing Section 40-9-1 of the Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. This Act may be cited as the Alaska Water Pollution Control Act.

Definitions.

Section 2. For the purpose of this Act:

(a) "Person" or "persons" means any individual, public or private corporation, political subdivision, government agency, municipality, industry, co-partnership,
