

CHAPTER 15

AN ACT

[H. B. 41]

To appropriate the sum of Eight Thousand Dollars as a deficiency appropriation to be used in paying United States Commissioners for recording Vital Statistics records and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

WHEREAS, it appears that the amount appropriated to pay United States Commissioners for recording Vital Statistics records was exhausted by December 31, 1948 and the sum of approximately Five Thousand Dollars remains unpaid to Commissioners for services prior to that time and needed before the end of the biennium, as computed by fees in force April 1, 1947; and

WHEREAS, the Administrative Office of the United States Courts at Washington, D. C. did on December 14, 1948 promulgate Bulletin No. 359 increasing payments required to be paid to United States Commissioners in connection with the recording of Vital Statistics records. This bulletin became effective January 1, 1949 and under it fees for recording Vital Statistics records were increased from \$1.10 in the First Division and \$1.65 in the Second, Third and Fourth Divisions to \$2.25 in each of the four Divisions, which necessitates the increase in payments to be made for the recording of Vital Statistics.

Section 1. That the sum of Eight Thousand Dollars not otherwise appropriated, or so much as may be necessary, be appropriated for the use of the Registrar of Vital Statistics in paying United States Commissioners for recording Vital Statistics certificates for the biennium ending March 31, 1949.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency clause.

CHAPTER 16

AN ACT

[C. S. H. B. 12]

To provide for a bounty for the killing of hair seal; and amending Secs. 33-3-131 and 33-3-132 ACLA 1949.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Sec. 33-3-131 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 33-3-131. BOUNTY ON HAIR SEAL DECLARED. There is hereby placed on every hair seal inhabiting the inland waters and all other waters of Alaska from Dixon Entrance to Demarcation Point, a bounty of \$6.00, such sum to be paid in accordance with the provisions following.

Rate for seal bounty.

Section 2. Sec. 33-3-132 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended by deleting the words and figure, (TWO DOLLARS (\$2.00)), wherever appearing therein and substituting therefor the words and figure Six Dollars (\$6.00).
