

and for the purpose of providing transportation of an attendant to care for said Ludwig Wolf on the trip from Sitka, Alaska, to Washington, D. C. That admission of said Ludwig Wolf to the Old Soldiers' Home is conditioned upon his arrival there not later than March 19, 1949.

Section 2. Disbursements hereunder shall be made upon vouchers approved by the Superintendent of the Pioneers' Home.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be effective immediately upon its passage and approval. ^{Emergency clause.}

CHAPTER 25

AN ACT

[H. B. 40]

To provide dependency allowances under the benefit provisions of the Unemployment Compensation Law, amending Sec. 51-5-2 ACLA 1949.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 51-5-2 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof, immediately following paragraph 3 of subsection (d), additional paragraphs designated (4) and (5) as follows:

(4) "DEPENDENCY ALLOWANCES".
Each individual who is eligible to receive benefits for unemployment with respect to any week shall be paid with respect to such week a dependency allowance of 20% of his weekly bene-

fit amount for each of such individual dependents who were being wholly or mainly supported by such individual, but in no event shall such allowances exceed 60% of the weekly benefit amount of such individual, except where the amount of dependency allowance is not a multiple of one dollar, in which case it shall be computed to the next higher multiple of one dollar. Dependency allowances shall be in addition to the unemployment benefits otherwise payable and shall not be considered part of an individual's weekly benefit amount. The maximum potential benefits in a benefit year shall not be increased for claimants with dependents' allowances, for when the weekly benefit is augmented by dependents' allowances, the maximum duration of benefits is decreased accordingly. No dependency allowance shall be payable with respect to any week unless an unemployment benefit is also payable with respect to such week. If both husband and wife received benefits with respect to a week of unemployment, neither shall be considered a dependent of the other and only one of them shall be entitled to dependency allowance with respect to dependents. Dependency allowances shall be effective with those claimants whose benefit years begin on or after July 1, 1949.

(5) "DEFINITION OF DEPENDENCY." A dependent means a wife; or son, daughter, stepson or stepdaughter of less than 18 years of age, who is not gainfully employed, and who is totally or mainly supported by the individual receiving the benefit; also a husband, mother, father, stepmother, stepfather, or brother, sister, son, daughter, stepson, or stepdaughter over the age of 18 years, who because of disability is unable to work and who is wholly or mainly

supported by the individual receiving the benefit. The foregoing dependency provisions shall apply only to dependents residing in Alaska.

CHAPTER 26

AN ACT

[H. B. 39]

Relating to gaming devices; amending Sec. 65-13-15 ACLA 1949; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Sec. 65-13-15 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 65-13-15. DEALING OR CONDUCTING GAMBLING GAME. That each and every person who shall deal, play, or carry on, open or cause to be opened, or who shall conduct, either as owner, proprietor or employee, whether for hire or not, any game of faro, monte, roulette, rouge-et-noir, lansquenet, rondo, vingt-un, twenty-one, poker, draw poker, brag, bluff, thaw, craps, or any banking or other game played with cards, dice, or any other device, whether the same shall be played for money, or for any checks, chips, credit representing money, or other representative of value, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars, and shall be imprisoned in
