

several polling places open for reception of votes from eight o'clock antemeridian until eight o'clock postmeridian on the day of election. The voting at said election shall be by printed or written ballot.

At all elections the ballot shall be substantially in the following form:

“FOR DELEGATE FROM ALASKA”

“(Here insert the name of the person voted for.)”

Such ballot shall be folded by the voter so as not to disclose the vote, and by him handed to any one of the judges of election, who shall immediately, in the presence of the voter and of all the members of the election board, deposit the same, folded as aforesaid, in the ballot box, where the same shall remain untouched until the polls are closed. At the time the ballot is so deposited the clerks of election shall each of them enter in his duplicate register the name of the voter and the fact that he has voted.

CHAPTER 50

AN ACT

[S. B. 41]

Pertaining to duties of the Territorial Treasurer; amending Sec.
7-1-6 ACLA 1949.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of Sec. 7-1-6 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) (Collection and deposit of moneys.) He shall demand, sue for, collect, receive and safely keep all moneys of the Territory from whatever source derived, which are not by law entrusted to the care and custody of some other officer. The Treasurer shall keep these funds in three or more solvent banks in the Territory and the amounts so deposited in the several banks shall be apportioned between such banks in proportion to the amount of funds in the treasury of the Territory and the size of the bank as measured by its capitalization and its financial condition as disclosed by its reports and by the examination made by the Banking Board. Provided, however, that before the Treasurer shall deposit any funds of the Territory in any such bank, said bank shall deposit with the Treasurer, as collateral security to secure such funds, bonds or other securities which are eligible to secure deposits of the United States, the aggregate market value of which shall at all times be at least equal to the funds deposited, or shall deposit other good bonds whose aggregate market value shall at all times be at least twenty per centum in excess of the deposits so secured, and mortgages insured by the government of the United States under the terms and provisions of the National Housing Act approved June 27, 1934, or shall enter into a bond to the Territory with a surety company, authorized as such to transact business in Alaska, as surety thereon, conditioned that it will safely keep and pay on

demand to the Treasurer as required by him, all funds of the Territory deposited with it. The banks in which Territorial funds are deposited shall pay interest on the average daily balance due the Territory at a rate to be fixed by the Banking Board, at a regular or special meeting of the Banking Board, and such interest when paid shall be covered into the treasury, Provided, further, that nothing in this section shall prohibit the Treasurer from depositing such funds as may be necessary for the proper conduct of his office in solvent banks outside the Territory of Alaska.

CHAPTER 51

AN ACT

[S. B. 43]

To repeal Sec. 33-3-120 ACLA 1949 pertaining to bounties on wolves killed from airplanes; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 33-3-120 ACLA 1949 is hereby re-^{Repeal.}pealed.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, ^{Emergency} and this Act shall be effective immediately upon its ^{clause.} passage and approval.
